




ABSTRACT

- **Cambridge Dictionary** defines Lynch Mob as- a group of people who want to attack someone who they think has committed a serious crime.²

The Mob Lynching Case : Tehseen Poonawala vs. Union of India

Introduction

Mob Lynching is not a novel concept in the world. Even India witness countless cases of Mob Lynchings regularly, either reported or not. Generally lynching means use of violence to punish the offender without any trial. The following dictionaries define mob lynching in the following way.

- According to the **Merriam-Webster Dictionary**, Lynch Mob is a crowd of people who kill or try to kill (someone) illegally as a punishment.¹
- **Cambridge Dictionary** defines Lynch Mob as- a group of people who want to attack someone who they think has committed a serious crime.²
