#### Introduction



These definitions lighten that Mob Lynching involves a group of furious people using violence to put an end on the life of an individual or attempts to do so without any trial.



#### The Mob Lynching Case: Tehseen Poonawala vs. Union of India

#### Introduction

Mob Lynching is not a novel concept in the world. Even India witness countless cases of Mob Lynchings regularly, either reported or not. Generally lynching means use of violence to punish the offender without any trial. The following dictionaries define mob lynching in the following way.

- · According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, Lynch Mob is a crowd of people who kill or try to kill (someone) illegally as a punishment.<sup>1</sup>
- Cambridge Dictionary defines Lynch Mob as- a group of people who want to attack someone who they think has committed a serious crime.<sup>2</sup>
- · As per Collins Dictionary, Lynch Mob is an angry crowd of people who want to kill someone without a trial because they believe that person has committed a crime.<sup>3</sup>

These definitions lighten that Mob Lynching involves a group of furious people using violence to put an end on the life of an individual or attempts to do so without any trial.
