MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) made and executed at Jodhpur on 4/3/2020⁰ March 04, 2020 between **JAI NARAIN VYAS UNIVERSITY, JODHPUR**, having its campus at **Residency Road , Jodhpur** (hereinafter referred to as **JNVU, Jodhpur** which expression shall, unless it is repugnant to the subject or context thereof, include its successors, assignees and /or nominees)

And

RAJASTHAN ILD SKILLS UNIVERSITY , JAIPUR having its campus at Khasa Kothi , MI Road , Jaipur (hereinafter referred to as **RISU , Jaipur** which expression shall, unless it is repugnant to the subject or context thereof, include its successors, assignees and /or nominees)

Whereas

Jai Narain Vyas University, Jodhpur holds the distinction of being premier state University of higher learning in Rajasthan. It was established in 1962 by Jodhpur University Act (Act XVII) and recognized from the time of its inception under sections 2f and 12B of UGC Act. The main objective of the University has been the creation and dissemination of knowledge.

And Whereas


RAJASTHAN ILD SKILLS UNIVERSITY , JAIPUR is a State University of Rajasthan established under the provisions of Rajasthan ILD Skills University Act , 2017 (Act no. 6 of 2017) for imparting skill education and training in the state of Rajasthan

1. Scope of MoU:

Both the parties in principle agree to work in the following areas of collaboration:

- a) cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests.
- b) collaborate in curriculum development for skill education and General education
- c) provide mutual access to facilities for the academic purposes as mutually agreed between the parties prior to commencement of the activity:
- d) conduct short courses, as mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity:
- e) areas of collaboration may be proposed by either institution and may include, but are not limited to:
 - Joint teaching, research, or cultural activity;
 - Mobility of faculty, scholars, and students between institutions;
 - Staff professional development;
 - Sharing or creation of educational materials and resources.

The RISU offers Concurrent Skills Courses to the students enrolled with other State Funded University as per its regulations. These courses in skill education can be taken up concurrently with the main course for

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which students has already enrolled. The classes are conducted beyond regular course timings. JNVU agrees to permit student enrolled by it for pursuing Concurrent Courses being provided by the RISU.

Any specific activity developed under this MOU shall be detailed in a subsequent agreement, signed by each institution's authorized signatory, which will describe the scope of the proposed activity, intended outcomes, budget, and responsible departments or individuals.

2. Commencement and Validity:

This Memorandum of Understanding shall commence on the date of signing of this MoU and shall remain valid initially for a period of five years (05), thereafter extendable upon review of activities and mutual interest.


3 Commercials:


Both the Parties shall work out commercials with respect to each individual work plan separately. In no case any financial or academic liability on one party would be transferrable on the other party.

4 Terminations:

- 4.1 In case of breach of contract both parties may, without assigning any reason, terminate this Memorandum of Understanding at any time by giving to the other party three month notice in writing sent by registered post or Speed Post or Courier.
- 4.2 Without prejudice to any other remedies both Parties shall have the right at any time by giving notice in writing to each other for terminating the Memorandum of Understanding forthwith in any of the following events:
 - 4.2.1 Any of the parties commit the breach of any of the terms or conditions of this Memorandum of Understanding.
 - 4.2.2 Any party enters into liquidation, whether compulsorily or voluntarily (otherwise than for the purposes of amalgamation or reconstruction) or compounds with creditors or takes or suffers any similar action in consequence of debt or in the case of an individual or a partnership.
 - 4.2.3 Any of the parties are guilty of any conduct which legally is prejudicial to the contracts interests.
 - 4.2.4 No party shall have authority to purport or assign the burden or benefits or charge the benefits of this Memorandum of Understanding without the consent in writing of the other Party.

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5 Force Majeure

- 5.1 If the performance of the obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding is prevented by reason of any contingencies, which could have been reasonably avoided and are beyond the control of the parties, the party so affected shall not be liable to the other for damages to the extent of such prevention. Such contingencies include strikes of workers, fire, flood, explosion, riots sabotage, acts of God and war or enemy action.

6 Notice

- 6.1 Save as hereinbefore otherwise provided, any notice required to be given hereunder shall be sufficiently given to each other if forwarded by registered post, speed post, courier, to the last known postal address of the parties. Every notice shall be deemed to have been received and given at the time when in the ordinary course of transmission it should have been delivered at the address to which it was sent.

7 Indemnity:

- 7.1 Both parties shall indemnify the each other against all losses, damages or claims that may arise out of any unauthorized representations made by their employees or representatives.

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Coaching Scheme for Entry into Services for SC/ST/ OBC (no creamy layer) and Minority Community Jai Narain Vyas University, Jodhpur

UGC Scheme: Coaching Classes for entry in services for SC/ST / OBC (no creamy layer) & Minorities Community Students (XII Plan (2012-2017))

1. Introduction

The well-being and development of the Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), OBC (non-creamy layer) and Minorities are important indicators of the strength and success of a democratic society. Specific provisions have been made to improve the status of these groups, socially and educationally, so that they can take their rightful place in society. Representation of the groups in All India / State / Provincial Services and equivalent positions in the private sector is an indicator of how far the country has been successful to equip them so that they are in a position to safeguard their own interests. In order to prepare students belonging to SC / ST/OBC (non-creamy layer) and Minority communities to get gainful employment in Central and other services mentioned above, the UGC allowed to continue the scheme of coaching classes for entry in services for SC / ST & Minorities during the Twelfth Plan.

2. Objectives

The basic objective of the coaching scheme was to prepare students belonging to SC / ST/ OBC (non-creamy layer) and Minority communities to get gainful employment in Group 'A', 'B' or 'C' Central services, State services or equivalent positions in the private sector. The coaching under the scheme should be oriented for particular examinations conducted for selection to services, such as the IAS, State Public Services, Bank recruitment, etc. The coaching may be focused, taking into consideration the specific requirements of a particular competitive examination.
